Domaine Joseph Voillot 2020 Pommard PC Les Rugiens

Delightfully scented, this offers up balsamic, evergreen, black cherries and licorice. This is supple, layered and precise with fine tannins reverberating against the lilting acidity. These vines are 58 years old on average, and the wine saw two-thirds new oak. This is the second-largest Premier Cru holding at Voillot, after Les Pézerolles. 2024-35



Domaine Joseph Voillot 2020 Pommard PC Les Epenots

Starting with bramble and dried kindling, this is a bright and lifted Pommard. Vinous yet tangy, its almost brashly youthful, and luckily its suave tannins will allow it to drink well rather early on. This hails from vines averaging 58 years old in Les Petits Epenots, and the wine saw only oak barrels of one or two wines. 2023-32



Domaine Joseph Voillot 2020 Pommard PC Les Pézerolles

While a year younger in average age than the Epenots, this wine saw a good dollop of one-third new oak. It has more grip and more substance to handle it. The tannins even have a lightly gruff edge to them, but there's a lovely plumpness of fruit in the mid-palate, which is thick with black plums, licorice and cola. 2025-35



Domaine Joseph Voillot 2020 Volnay PC Les Caillerets

This has all the prettiness of Volnay: floral nuances and mulberries and blueberries galore plus an intriguing hint of balsamic. The tannins are fine and almost creamy and the acidity offers mouth-watering refreshment. This is the smallest of the Voillot Volnay holdings at only 0.1398 hectare. 2022-32
