<u>2016 Meursault "Les Chevalières"</u>: There is a vague suggestion of the exotic to the aromas of white peach, pear and softly floral-scented nose. The very generously proportioned and nicely rich medium weight flavors possess a lovely texture before concluding in a lemony and bone dry finish. This should drink well shortly after release. 88/2020+

**2016 Meursault "Les Cras":** An agreeably fresh nose combines notes of hazelnut, white orchard fruit and lemon rind with those of floral and the barest hint of oak. The mouth feel of the medium-bodied flavors is also quite rich and generously proportioned, all wrapped in a tangy and overtly lemony finish. In contrast to the more forward Chevalières, this will need at least a year or two to unwind. 90/2021+
