**2017 Bourgogne Aligoté:** A moderately fresh and ultra-spicy nose reflects mostly notes of apple and citrus. The racy, intense and lightly stony flavors possess very fine depth and persistence on the nicely dry finish for a wine at this level. Note that this would make a fine choice for an all-around summer sipper. 87/2020+

**2017 Meursault "Les Chevalières":** A classic Meursault nose offers up notes of hazelnut, citrus, acacia and a range of white-fleshed fruit scents. The rich and attractively vibrant medium-bodied flavors possess very good volume before concluding in a mineral-driven, complex and lengthy finish. This too is quite good and worth a look. 89/2022+

**2017 Meursault "Les Cras":** This is aromatically similar to the Chevalières with just a bit more floral influence. On the palate though there is noticeably more volume and mid-palate density along with a fine depth and persistence on the balanced and more structured finale where a touch of minerality adds the sensation of lift. Lovely. 91/2023+
