Transparent crimson. Rather sweaty nose without real focus. A bit mean on the palate. Astringent finish.

Dom Joseph Voillot, Vieilles Vignes 2016 Pommard

Pale crimson. Very ripe nose – lots of sweetness and then rather scrawny and astringent on the finish with a hint of bitterness. Not very graceful.

• Dom Joseph Voillot, Champans Premier Cru 2016 Volnay

Hint of woodiness on the nose. The fruit is not the purest nor the most expressive. But it has some core and may eventually blossom to dominate the aroma.

Drink 2025-2034 £495 per case of 12 ib Goedhuis & Co 16

Dom Joseph Voillot, Les Caillerets Premier Cru 2016 Volnay

Again there is just a hint of fustiness on the nose. Sweet start and light to medium body with quite marked acidity and some bitterness on the end.

Drink 2024-2033 £495 per case of 12 ib Goedhuis & Co 15.5+

Dom Joseph Voillot, Les Pézerolles Premier Cru 2016 Pommard

Sweet and juicy on the nose with some hard-candy element. Very hard work on the drying end. The fruit seems to be sucked out.

Drink 2023-2031 £695 per case of 12 ib Goedhuis & Co 15.5

• Dom Joseph Voillot, Les Rugiens Premier Cru 2016 Pommard

By far the cleanest nose of this range. Easy, perfumed and polished Pommard for relatively early drinking. By which I mean you don't actually have to wait for the tannins to fade.
