The palate is medium-bodied with supple tannin, tender in style with beautifully judged acidity that makes this Pommard feel so natural and imbued with weightlessness. The palate is medium-bodied with fine tannin, impressive depth of fruit but the terroir shines through. The finish is beautifully defined with a touch of spice and <i>pain d'épices</i> on the finish.
